### WE NEED YOU !!!


New Board Members will receive education and a mentor to assist them.

### PLEASE BE AWARE ... SECURITY CONCERNS

It was brought to our attention recently that there have been a number of attempted break-ins during the weeks around the Christmas holidays. A resident was woken up by noises of someone trying to open a window in the back of her house. Her flood lights came on and scared that person away. Police were called in, unfortunately they were unable to find anything.

Another instance that happened in the same area, around the same time, with a home (Snow Bird) being ransacked and it looked like it may have been lived in by vandals. Again, Police were notified, and an investigation was carried out.

Please ... Please be aware of security in and around your home. A few tips on how to make your home and yourself safe:

- Flood lights or motion lights placed in dak areas not readily visible
- Motion detector cameras are useful to capture evidence of intruders
- Lock all doors, windows, and car doors, even if you are home to ensure safety
- Do not answer the door unless you know that person, or that person shows a valid ID

Be mindful and most importantly, if you see or hear anything, call the Police immediately. Have a Happy, Healthy and Safe New Year.

### Homeowner's Association Meeting

Date: January 2, 2025

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757

Time: 6:30 pm - 23 residents in attendance.

- I. Call to Order: President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 6:40pm
- II. Guest Presentation: Christine Menegus and two other representatives from Advanced Radiology Solutions summarized the outpatient healthcare services offered at its Office Based Location in Manasquan, NJ. More specific information was provided concerning varicose vein treatment and alternative treatments for arthritis pain, among the other healthcare services offered with and without a referral from a physician. Contact literature was provided.
- **III. Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Pat Tatulli, Pete Sztybel, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Dave Fuhrman, Kathy Conte and Debbie Moriarty. Absent: Mike Joffe, Mary Conery.
- IV. President's Announcements: included notifying members that:
  - **A.** The Board has elected to pursue foreclosure for Owners who have continuously ignored efforts to bring their accounts up to date.
  - **B.** The Board has decided that names and/or addresses of owners with liens will not be made public. Only total overdue balances and liens, absent owner information will be published in the Echo. However, because the Association Attorney has advised us that there are no legal obstacles to revealing this information, Owners interested in obtaining it may inquire at the office.
  - C. The Call for Nominations and Budget Ballot will be mailed out on January 8<sup>th</sup>. The Budget includes an increase of \$10 per quarter. There will be a meeting to discuss the budget and increase on January 23 at 7pm and the Call for Nominations and completed budget ballot are due on January 31, 2025. Owners were reminded that a yes vote accepts the budget and increase and a no vote keeps the current budget in place and could require a special assessment by the end of the year.
  - **D.** This year in compliance with Federal law, the Association is conducting its required survey of residents. A HOPA form for use by owners and tenants to report their names, ages and resident status is available on the Association website and copies will be inserted in the next few issues of the Echo. Completed forms are due in the office by May 31, 2025. Owners who do not meet the deadline will be fined \$25 per month until the office has received their completed forms.
  - **E.** The next HOA meeting is scheduled for February 6, 2025.
- V. Approval of Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve Minutes of the December 5<sup>th</sup>2024 Homeowner's meeting was made by Jim Clarke, seconded by Kathy Conte and approved unanimously.
- VI. Approval of the Treasurer's report: Treasurer Scott Stern reported that the budget is showing a positive balance as of December, 2024. He also stated that a meeting will be scheduled to discuss reserves early this coming week; time and date will be communicated in an email blast. Owners are encouraged to attend. The Treasurer's report was approved by Dave Fuhrman, seconded by Debbie Moriarty and approved unanimously.

#### VII. New Business:

### A. Administrative Report:

- 1. Real Estate: Kathy reported 4 homes sold, 5 homes for sale and 4 active flippers.
- 2. Delinquent Accounts and Vacant Properties: 28 owners did not pay their third quarter dues. Violation fees collected amounted to \$2,825 and late fees to \$425. There are currently 8 homes with liens amounting to \$33,525.46.
- 3. Schedule for Closing Fees: The Board has approved the following fees for homes closed in SRPE: For closings unencumbered by liens or other issues, the fee is \$75; for homes with liens or other matters complicating the closing process, the fee is \$150 and for encumbered closings where the services of an Attorney are required, the fee will be \$500.
- **B.** Coalition Report: PTR1 and PTR2 Senior Freeze checks will be going to the Township rather than to the residents this year. There will be a meeting on January 16<sup>th</sup> where more information will be provided. Two Ocean County mobile units will be coming out to the Associations to provide tax forms and information. They may be accompanied by members of the Ocean County Health Department. More information will be provided at future coalition meetings. Activities are being

planned to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Berkeley Township and will be reported in local newspapers. Legislation was passed by the State per Bill H.R. 82 that eliminates reductions made to Social Security benefits for state and local employees who receive other benefits. AARP is offering a 6 hour driving class to seniors for \$20 for members and \$25 for non-members. Attendees will receive a reduction in car insurance. Contact Debbie if you are interested. A group class may be available if enough people show interest.

#### VIII. **Continuing Business:**

A. Upcoming vote to approve the budget for next year: Debbie urged everyone to attend the upcoming meeting on January 23 at 7 to discuss the budget. She stated that completed ballots and the Call for Nominations are due in the office by January 31st.

#### IX. Motions:

A. Chimney repair: Motion to approve replacement of the clubhouse chimney for an amount not to exceed \$4,000 funded by the Reserve Account was made by Debbie Moriarty, approved by Kathy Conte, seconded by Pat Tatulli and unanimously approved. Debbie added that the final price for the project was \$3,675.

#### X. **Section Reports:**

- A. Section 2: Pat reported several break-ins on Christmas Eve. He recommended owners keep their doors and windows locked and keep lights on at night, especially in the back where someone can move about unseen in the dark. If you see or hear anything unusual call the police.
- B. Sections 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9 reported no issues
- C. Section 12: Debbie reported a home with an infant in residence and stated the situation is being attended to.

#### XI. **Committee Reports:**

- A. Beautification: Debbie stated that the committee will reconvene in the spring.
- B. Entertainment & Flea Market: Gail reported income and expenses for Entertainment and Flea Market for the year 2024. After four major events, the ending balance in the Entertainment bank account was \$3,258 with a profit of \$523 for the year. She stated that the account balance will be allocated to a catered event for the Community to take place in April of 2025. More information about this event will be forthcoming. The Flea Market had three events during 2024. The ending balance in the Flea Market account is \$4,257 and profit for the year was \$814. Expenditures between the two sets of events go to decorations, supplies, food, drink and entertainment. They are detailed in the financial reports maintained monthly and released to the Audit Committee yearly.
- C. House Committee: Debbie complimented the Christmas decorations and Gail requested help with taking them down and storing them on Thursday, January 9that 2pm. She also said she will be contacting the cleaning contractor to strip and wax the kitchen floor and added that the Flea Market will be contributing funds to have the rugs in the clubhouse cleaned.
- D. Hospitality Committee: Linda thanked everyone who brought snacks to share.
- E. Park Echo: Gail said the deadline for the February Park Echo is January 6<sup>th</sup> and asked anyone who wants to contribute to the issue to send her an email at her email address published in the Echo.
- Pins and Needles: Cookie reported that the committee is doing well. She stated that the book drive was a success and the Children's hospital on Rt. 37 was grateful for the contribution of 15 brand new childrens' books. Pins and Needles Meets every Tuesday from 1pm to 3pm in the library.
- G. Sunshine Committee: Elva reported that 5 Echos were mailed to former residents, 3 get well cards and 1 sympathy card. She thanked homeowners in advance for their calls.
- H. Welcome Committee: Gail reported that 5 new owners were given welcome packets this month.
- XII. Comments from the Membership: A resident complimented the job the Entertainment Committee does with events for which the charge is minimal given the quality delivered. She also inquired about the notice sent to residents concerning an internet portal and was advised that the email notifying owners of the portal was sent out mistakenly by the programmers from the accounting software provider's IT department. Another owner suggested posting cautionary information about the recent break-ins in the Echo.
- Next Meetings: Next agenda meeting will be held on Thursday, January 16th 2025 at 10:00 AM; The next XIII. HOA meeting is scheduled for February 6, 2025 at 6:30PM.
- XIV. **Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 by Phil Cupo.

### Frequently Asked Questions

#### WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF MOVING TO AUTOMATED TRASH COLLECTION?

Automation is a faster and a more efficient way to collect residential solid waste. Additionally, other towns that have moved to automated collection have reported an increase in recycling rates and an overall reduction in the amount of trash collected. The hinged lids help to keep rainwater out of the cans, reduce trash weight, and are animal-proof as well. In addition to anticipated time and cost savings, the program will help keep our neighborhoods neat and clean, improve safety on residential streets, and provide safer working conditions for trash collectors. Cans are durable and easy to maneuver.

### WILL CURRENT EMPLOYEES LOSE THEIR JOBS?

NO! This plan is not in place to lay off any public works employees.

### IS THERE A COST FOR THE NEW CANS?

Your first trash and recycling cans are free. There will be a cost to purchase any additional cans.

### WHAT ARE THE SIZES OF THE NEW CANS?

Berkeley Township is offering one (1) sixty-five (65) gallon trash and one (1) sixty-five (65)-gallon recycling can. Residents may request a ninety-five (95) gallon can in advance. Please note a sixty-five (65) gallon can holds 4-5 tall kitchen trash bags and a ninety-five (95) gallon can hold 7-8 tall kitchen trash bags.

### CAN I ORDER ADDITIONAL CANS?

For an additional cost you may purchase up to one (1) more trash and or recycling can.

### WHEN WILL WE RECEIVE OUR NEW CANS?

Cans will be delivered to every home within Holiday City sometime after the new year. Appointments are not necessary, and you do not need to be home to receive your new trash can. If you travel during the winter, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and put your trash can delivery on hold.

### WHEN WILL THE AUTOMATED COLLECTION BEGIN?

You may start using your new can once it's delivered to you.

### WHAT DO THE NEW CANS LOOK LIKE?

Berkeley Township has selected Burgundy, 65-gallon trash cans and Blue 65-gallon recycling cans. These cans will help to keep our residential streets neat and clean. All trash cans will have the Township logo on the side and will be linked to your address via a serial number embedded in the plastic.

### CAN I USE THE CAN I ALREADY HAVE?

No. Only those cans provided by the Township will be collected. Cans other than those provided by the township will not be collected.

### WHAT DO I DO WITH MY CAN IF I MOVE?

Trash/Recycling Cans are issued and owned by the Township and must remain at the property address to which they are assigned.

### THE NEW CANS LOOK BIG. ARE THEY EASY TO WHEEL TO AND FROM THE CURB?

New Trash & Recycling cans are designed for weight distribution and safety. They are easy to maneuver empty and full. Most importantly they are senior friendly and roll easily on all types of terrain.

### WHAT DO I DO WITH MY OLD TRASH CAN?

You may leave your old can at the curb, and it will be disposed of for you by the Department of Public Works.

### ARE THE NEW CANS ANIMAL PROOF?

The new cans are the most animal proof available. If you store your can outside and encounter a problem with animals, you can use a bungee cord to secure the lid to the lift bar, but please remember to remove the bungee cord on your collection day or your can will not be emptied.

### WILL MY COLLECTION DAY REMAIN THE SAME?

Yes. Your trash will continue to be collected weekly, and on the same collection day. Trash & Recycling cans are to be placed at the curb no earlier than the evening prior and no later than 6 am of your collection day.

### WHAT IF MY CAN GETS DAMAGED?

Contact the Department of Public Works at (732) 349-4616 to report a damaged can.

### WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH OVERFLOW TRASH THAT DOES NOT FIT INTO MY CAN?

Your new trash can accommodate as much volume as 2 to 3 standard-sized trash cans. We expect these cans to be sufficient for your household needs. If you have a one-time overflow of trash, please hold it until your next regular collection day or drop it off at the Ocean County Landfill. If you continue to have an overflow of trash or recycling, a second can should be purchased.

### WILL I STILL RECEIVE BULK COLLECTION

Bulk Collection will be scheduled on an as needed basis. If you have items to put out for bulk, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and schedule your bulk pick up.

### HOW DO I PREPARE MY TRASH CAN FOR WEEKLY SET-OUT?

All trash must be bagged before being placed in the can. The lid to the can must close tightly. Your cans should be free of any obstacle such as mailboxes, telephone poles, vehicles, and any overhead obstructions. The can's handle and wheels are to face the house. The lids opening is to face the street. No material is to be sticking out of the can. Trash and recycling cans are to be placed at the curb approximately three (3) feet apart from each other, and at least four (4) feet from any other obstacle.

### WHAT IF I AM DISABLED?

Our disabled residents must provide a prescription provided by your doctor stating you are disabled and cannot walk your trash and recycling cans to the curb. Once we receive this prescription a team member from public works will bring your can to the curb to be emptied. Prescriptions must be renewed yearly and received by January 31. Extensions may be granted by calling the public works office.

### WHAT HAPPENS IF MY COLLECTION DAY FALLS ON A HOLIDAY?

If your trash/recycling collection falls on a Holiday it will be delayed one (1) day. If your trash is not picked up, please leave it at the curb for the next day until the department catches up. The departments' goal is to be back on track within 24-48 hours of the holiday

### ARE THERE ANY ITEMS NOT PERMITTED FOR TRASH COLLECTION?

- Yard Waste such as leaves, grass clippings, and brush.
- Hot ash from fireplace or fire pits
- Any other hazardous, flammable, combustible materials: such as oil-based paints, solvents, asbestos, or commercial medical waste.

### WHAT GOES IN MY RECYCLING CAN?

- Loose Recyclable Plastics #1,2,5 (Lids and caps can be left on)
- Glass Bottles, Jars and Containers
- Aluminum, Steel, Tin, and Bi-Metal Cans
- Paper, Cardboard, Newspapers, Magazines
- ALL BOTTLES AND CANS SHOULD BE RINSED

### WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED IN MY RECYCLING CAN?

- PLASTIC BAGS
- Egg cartons
- Pizza Boxes
- Window glass
- Aluminum Foil

ALSO, IMPORTANT TO NOTE: <u>Do Not</u> call 911 unless there is a 'real' emergency.

- Speeding on our roads YOU CAN complain to the Chief of Police, Kevin Santucci @ 732-341-1132, a non-emergency number. A license plate number would be helpful.
- Unregistered/uninsured cars YOU CAN contact the police and/or code enforcer @ 732-244-7400 x1237 who can ask the resident for their auto registration and proof of insurance, tickets can be issued.
- Load Mufflers/Noise YOU CAN call Berkeley
   Township Police Officers who can check cars for
   illegal mufflers and excessive idling. It is very
   helpful to provide the location and time of day
   these incidents occur. This will further help the
   investigation.
- Parking opposite traffic is illegal, YOU CAN call the BTPD to report @ 732-341-1132.
- Feeding the Deer –YOU CAN call Animal Control @ 732-797-1413, a summons and fine may be issued – a photo would back up your complaint.

# PLEASE REPORT ANY CHANGES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical / HOPA purposes.

### Typical changes would include:

- A new or additional phone number
- A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- Deed changes

### **SRPE Illegal Home Rentals**

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, skirt age restrictions, or perhaps just plain ignorance.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be age 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for one year as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

### **ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners**

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears.
Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of December 31st, a total of \$36,385.46 are due. Out of that total, 28 residents are in arrears (unpaid dues) totaling \$2,860.00 and 9 Liens (\$33,525.46). Contact the office, during business hours if you want more info.

### **Garbage & Recycling Pick-Ups**

They accept trip reservations on a first-come, first served basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. Pick-Up and Drop-Off Times: 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (Last pick-up)

Trip requests are not accepted via email. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our **Drivers are not permitted to enter your home**, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service. Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING onboard the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.

### Children's Book Drive Success


Thank you to all who donated books for our Christmas Book Drive for the RWJ Children's Hospital on Route 37 in Toms River.

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

### Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our Covenants & Restrictions states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- Renting/Leasing: Article 10, Section(c) of our Covenants & Restrictions states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a "Continued Certificate of Occupancy" (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
